Dr. Felix is also the Director of CAST (Catholic Archdiocesan School Teachers)?a master of arts and preliminary teaching credential program designed for current full-time Catholic school educators from the Archdioceses of Los Angeles and San Francisco and the Dioceses of Fresno, Oakland, Orange, Sacramento, San Bernardino, and Stockton. Before joining LMU, Dr. Felix served at Nativity Catholic School, located in the Vermont-Slauson community of Los Angeles, in many capacities? first as a junior high math and science teacher, later as the director of marketing and development, and eventually as principal.
