Asa Palley is an Assistant Professor of Operations and Decision Technologies at the Kelley School of Business at Indiana University. He received a Ph.D. in Decision Sciences at the Fuqua School of Business at Duke University, where he also completed a Certificate in College Teaching. Previously, he earned an A.B. from Bowdoin College, an M.S. in Applied Mathematics and Scientific Computation from the University of Maryland at College Park, and an M.S. in Mathematics from Carnegie Mellon University. My research uses methods from decision analysis, operations research, and behavioral economics to model and provide insights into managerial decision problems. I aim to develop simple and effective prescriptive solutions to equip managers with better information and improve decision-making. My work has been published in the journals Management Science, Experimental Economics, and Risk Analysis.
