Elizabeth Franklin Lewis, Professor of Spanish, received a Ph.D. (1993) and M.A. (1989) in Spanish literature from the University of Virginia, after earning a B.A. (1987) in Spanish from Auburn University. She researches women writers and gender issues in 18th- and 19th-century Spain. Among her recent publications are two books, Eve?s Enlightenment: Women?s Experience in Spain and Spanish America, 1726-1839 (LSU Press, 2009), and Women Writers of the Spanish Enlightenment: The Pursuit of Happiness (Ashgate, 2004), and two articles, ?Actos de caridad: Women?s Charitable Work in Eighteenth-Century Spain? (2008) and ?The Sensibility of Motherhood: Josefa Amar y Borbón?s Discurso sobre la educación fisica y moral de las mujeres (1790)? (2002). Dr. Lewis was awarded a 2011-2012 Mary Washington Faculty Development Grant for the project ?Women and Charity in Spain, 1786-1939,? a digital humanities project that she is completing with a team of undergraduate research students.
