Biography

Carrie Liu Currier (M.A., Ph.D. University of Arizona; B.A. University of Michigan) is an Associate Professor in the Department of Political Science. She is also the director of the Texas National Consortium for Teaching about Asia (NCTA), an initiative funded by the Freeman Foundation to facilitate teaching and learning about East Asia in elementary and secondary schools nationwide. Her research focuses on Asian politics, international relations and global political economy, and the experiences of Asian Pacific Americans in the academy with publications in the following areas: 1) economic reform in China, to understand how developing countries are adapting to the demands of globalization, 2) China?s Foreign Policy with the Middle East, examining both arms transfers and the pursuit of energy, 3) China?s energy policy and pursuit of resources, 4) China?s one child policy and its social implications, 5) the politics of entrepreneurship in Taiwan and China, and 6) Asian Pacific Americans in the discipline. Dr. Currier has conducted survey research in both China and Taiwan, examining labor market reforms as well as analyzing the role the state has played in fostering entrepreneurship. Her publications include: a co-edited book (with Manochehr Dorraj) China?s Energy Relations with the Developing World, several book chapters, and articles in the following journals: American Journal of Chinese Studies, Asian Journal of Women's Studies, China Public Affairs Quarterly, Journal of Chinese Political Science, Journal of Political Science Education, Journal of Women Politics and Policy, and Middle East Policy. In addition she is co-editor on a forthcoming handbook on Gender and Politics.
