Gerald Gamm is a professor of political science and history at the University of Rochester and researches American politics, political development, legislatures, parties, and state and local politics. Current research is on Congress, state legislatures, and urban politics. He is the author of two books: *The Making of New Deal Democrats* (University of Chicago Press, 1989), and *Urban Exodus: Why the Jews Left Boston and the Catholics Stayed* (Harvard University Press, 1999). There's also a forthcoming book (with Steven S. Smith) on the development of Senate party leadership in the 19th and 20th centuries. He teaches courses in the fields of American politics and American history.
