Dr. David Weiner is an expert in resistant hypertension, primary aldosteronism and autosomal dominant polycystic disease.

Biography

Dr. David Weiner is a professor in the Division of Nephrology, Hypertension & Renal Transplantation. He directs a pre-clinical research program that is working to understand the fundamental mechanisms through which the kidneys maintain the correct acid-base balance in the body. His major clinical interests involve refractory hypertension, including specific expertise in primary hyperaldosteronism and renovascular hypertension, genetic causes of hypertension, such as Liddle's Syndrome, electrolyte disorders, such as Gitelman's and Bartter's syndrome, autosomal polycystic kidney disease, and chronic kidney disease associated with solid-organ transplantation (non-renal transplants, only). He also maintains an active practice in management of patients with chronic kidney disease of other etiologies.
