Dr. Keith M. Bradshaw serves as associate dean of the College of Performing and Visual Arts at Southern Utah University. He is a music professor and a composer whose work is contemporary and has been performed internationally. Dr. Bradshaw serves as composer-in-residence with the Orchestra of Southern Utah. He is also founding director of the Red Rock Singers, a mixed choir of 40 voices in Cedar City, Utah, and has conducted various college and community choirs. He works as an engraver, orchestrator, arranger, and transcriber, and has had his work published by Oxford, Alfred, and Sounds of Zion. After receiving bachelor's and master's degrees in music from Brigham Young University, Dr. Bradshaw earned his Ph.D. in composition at University of Minnesota. Prior to joining SUU, he founded the music program at Southern Virginia University, and served as chair of the division of arts.
