Dr. Mukerjee is a bilingual board certified pediatrician (English/Spanish) and the director for immigrant and refugee health for the department of pediatrics. She also serves as the medical director of the New Orleans Children's Health Project (NOCHP). Her area of expertise is in addressing the complex primary care needs of uninsured refugee children primarily from Central America. She has been developing a medical home for these children at a partner clinical site, Crescent Care. Additionally, she engages in local, state and national advocacy on issues related to decreasing health disparities for children. She also supervises residents and medical students at the Tulane general pediatrics clinic where she serves as an Associate Program Director for the Tulane-Ochsner pediatric resident program.
