Stone is known for his studies on international political economy, international relations, and Russian and European politics.

Biography

Stone's research focuses on international finance and international organizations. His books include *Controlling Institutions: International Organizations and the Global Economy* (Cambridge, 2011), for which he was awarded the International Studies Association's Chadwick F. Alger Prize in 2012; *Lending Credibility: The International Monetary Fund and the Post-Communist Transition* (Princeton, 2002); and *Satellites and Commissars: Strategy and Conflict in the Politics of Soviet-Bloc Trade* (Princeton, 1996). Articles have appeared in the *American Political Science Review*, *International Organization*, *Journal of Politics*, *British Journal of Political Science*, *International Studies Quarterly*, the *Journal of Conflict Resolution*, *Review of International Organizations*, and *Global Environmental Politics*. Has been awarded grants by the NSF, SSRC, NCEEER, and IREX, and was the last recipient of the Soviet Peace Prize (1991). Stone teaches courses in international relations, international and comparative political economy, international organization, and Russian and East European politics. Stone has been cited by the *New York Times*, CNBC, PBS News, and *Foreign Policy Magazine* for his insight into current affairs in Ukraine and Crimea.
