Professor, History, Politics, and Geography at Farmingdale State College Farmingdale, NY, US

Dr. Saunders teaches from a global point of view; he is an expert on British comedian Sacha Baron Cohen.

Biography

Robert A. Saunders is a leading scholar of popular geopolitics, as well as an internationallyrecognized researcher in the field of nation branding. His geographic areas of focus include Russia, Central Asia, and Nordic Europe. His research explores the impact of popular culture on geopolitics, nationalism, and religious identity. His articles have appeared in Millennium, Geopolitics, Political Geography, Politics, Social & Cultural Geography, Progress in Human Geography, Nations and Nationalism, Slavic Review and Europe-Asia Studies. A Professor in the Department of History. Politics, and Geography at Farmingdale State College - SUNY, Dr. Saunders teaches courses on International Relations and human geography. He holds a Ph.D. in Global Affairs from Rutgers University and degrees in History from Stony Brook University (M.A.) and the University of Florida (B.A.). Based on his extensive work on Kazakhstan's feud with the British comedian Sacha Baron Cohen, Harper's labeled him the "world's leading Boratologist." His 2008 book on the subject is entitled The Many Faces of Sacha Baron Cohen: Politics, Parody, and the Battle over Borat. Building on this research, Popular Geopolitics and Nation Branding in the Post-Soviet Realm (Routledge, 2017) explores the tension between Western pop-culture representations of the fifteen former Soviet republics and their own attempts at country branding. His co-edited volume Popular Geopolitics: Plotting an Evolving Interdiscipline was published by Routledge in 2018. Professor Saunders is currently completing a monograph on geopolitics, northern Europe, and Nordic noir television series for Routledge. His next book, Landscape and Television - Bodies, Geopolitics, and Ecologies (coauthored with Irina Souch and Anne Marit Waade), is under contract with Palgrave. In 2016, Dr. Saunders was awarded the prestigious Chancellor?s Award for Excellence in Scholarship and Creative Activities, a system-wide accolade for sustained scholarship presented by the State University of New York. Dr. Saunders has held visiting researcher positions at the University of Leeds, Aarhus University, and Malmö University. He is an Honorary Fellow of the Leeds Russian Centre: additionally, he is an Affiliate Partner of the Centre for Transnational Media Research at Aarhus University as well as with the DETECt: Detecting Transcultural Identity in European Popular Crime Narratives, funded by a European Union Horizon 2020 grant.
